By establishing a field of interest fund, you can target your gift to address needs in the area of community life that you care most about. Suggestions include youth, arts, Alaska Native culture, health, seniors and many other issues. Once you create the fund, the ACF Board awards grants to community organizations and programs that are making a difference in the area you select. Your gift stays flexible enough to meet community needs in your interest area — even as they change over time.

### Strategic

Your field of interest fund enables ACF to address the community's changing needs in the areas you designate.

### Easy

You can rest assured knowing that your charitable dollars are being wisely invested, managed and granted.

### Flexible

You can add to the fund whenever you want. ACF can accept donations of almost any asset, including appreciated stock and real property. You and others who care about the issue can contribute to a field of interest fund so there's even more to give away.

### Financial Facts

There is no fee to establish a fund. Your funds will be endowed, ensuring grants can be made in perpetuity. The administrative fee is 1% calculated monthly based on the average daily balance. There is no minimum opening gift but funds need to maintain a minimum balance of \$5,000 within three years of establishing the fund.
